

Cont. Ed: LGBTQ+ Discrimination in the Workplace: Tips for Creating a Sense of Inclusion and Belonging



Training Description:

This 2-hour workshop will focus on issues of discrimination within the LGBTQ+ and how they present in the work environment. A discussion of barriers to inclusion, the impact of these barriers and applicable steps to having practices of inclusion within the workplace will also be addressed.



Dr. Hutter is currently providing services in various roles. Dr. Hutter holds one master's degree in Marriage and Family Therapy, another in Clinical Psychology, and a Doctorate in Clinical Psychology.
